This dance features a Chetvorno rhythm Slow Quick Quick

together with a **Kopanitsa** rhythm Quick Quick Slow Quick Quick

So overall that can be called as an 18/16.



Sardine fishing off the Black Sea coast is a traditional occupation and the traditional costume for this dance involves many dangling silvery pieces that the dancers shake to mimic the jumping of the sardines when caught in the nets




Our final dance on today's tour is from Israel.

Strictly there is no traditional Israeli costume, they just dance on the beaches, or anywhere else, in their jeans and t-shirts.

Many Israeli performers use the colours of the Israeli flag.

Our final dance is called Salamati. It's truly multi-cultural. Choreographed in Israel and set to a song sung in Farsi. The name means 'cheers' - it's actually a drinking song!!
