Well done to all the dancers and teachers and a particular thanks and congratulations to Palenque who choreographed our dances. Thanks also to Sara who was a mentor for the Israeli dances, and to Laurel and her group, Les Enfants de Provence who joined us for Eurodance.

Our performance at Fairbridge was the filling in a sandwich of events. The week-end before saw us up at Hillarys Boat Harbour for the **SunSmart** dance

event. There we danced Hora Medura, Smogyi Karikazo, Kreutz König, Tarantella, Chassapiko and Joc din Slatina, the same dances as Fairbridge although the order was different. The Sunsmart performance was a real test with a small stage and canned music that kept jumping!!

The week after Fairbridge saw the Group performing Joc Din Slatina, Tarantella and Dans Cu Suçitoare (the 'stick' dance) as part of the **International Dance Day** at the Cultural Centre in Northbridge. This was enthusiastically received by a big crowd.

Dance Workshops in France

Tales of Laurel de Vietri's January trip

Apart from spending time with my children who now live in Aix-en-Provence and Paris, I had some enriching experiences in the world of dance while I was in France over the Christmas holidays.

Gabrielle and I travelled up to the Auvergne from Aix for a weekend known as Le Bal du Cochon (the pig ball) put on by the dance and music group, "Les Brayauds". The weekend consisted of 3 three-hour bourrée workshops over the Saturday and Sunday, terrific workshops for advanced dancers, and a ball on the Saturday night which went all night. The ceremonial killing of the pig on Saturday morning meant that we had wonderful meals all weekend of grilled pork, blood sausage, and various other Auvergnat specialties and local wines and juices.

I also visited Limoux, a town in the Gascogne region, for an all day dance course in branles of the Ossau Valley in Bearn. What luck I had to spend 3 days there while they were in the midst of their Carnaval celebrations! They celebrate Carnaval from Jan 6th through to Mar 30th and I was welcomed by their magical procession of costumed musicians and dancers, masks and confetti, in an ancient rite which was far from the commercial Mardi Gras celebration

held in Nice, and the celebrations continued for the whole of my visit. This was a real bonus on top of a rewarding workshop by the director of the Occitanian Conservatory of Traditional Dance and Music of Toulouse, Pierre Corbefin.

Before I left France I went to an international dance class in Paris with Monika and her group "Danses d'Ici et d'Ailleurs". We danced 'Shetnya' from Serbia, 'Halleluya' from Israel, 'Zonaradkos' from Greece, 'Kalon Koritz' from Greece, 'Opa Tsupa', a Romany Gypsy dance, and a Jewish Swedish dance whose name escaped me. These were all new to me and it was a very enjoyable evening. The group is restricted to circle dances since they dance around a cement pylon in the middle of the floor!
